CAREER-RELATED PROGRAMME - GRADE 11 AND 12

- The CP provides a comprehensive educational framework that combines highly regarded and internationally recognized courses, from the IB Diploma Programme (DP), with a unique CP core and an approved career-related study.
- The CP helps students to prepare for effective participation in life, fostering attitudes and habits of mind that allow them to become lifelong learners and to get involved in learning that develops their capacity and will to make a positive difference.



HOW DO UNIVERSITIES AROUND THE WORLD VIEW THE CP?

- The International Baccalaureate Career-related Programme (IBCP) is recognized by universities and higher education institutions around the world, and graduates of the program are eligible to apply for higher education courses in many countries.
- During that period, our CP students requested that their transcripts be sent to universities and colleges in 35 countries, across North America, Africa, Europe, the Middle East, Asia and Australasia.
- CP students requested that their transcripts be sent to over 1,000 universities around the world, including more than 750 institutions in the United States and more than 130 in the United Kingdom. Examples of Universities in the US, UK & UAE: Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Johns Hopkins University, University of California Los Angeles. University of Durham, The University of Edinburgh, King's College London, American University in Dubai, University of Sharjah.



HOW DO STUDENTS ACHIEVE THE **CAREER-RELATED DIPLOMA CERTIFICATE?**

BTEC Extended Diploma Distinction = 3A* @ A Levels = 168 UCAS points DP HL grade 7 = 1 A* @A level = 56 UCAS points. DP SL grade 7 = 1 A @AS level = 28 UCAS points

- The two DP academic subjects are graded from 7 (highest) to 1 (lowest). Students must achieve a 3 or more to pass Standard Level courses.
- BTEC is graded with a PASS, MERIT or DISTINCTION, based on cumulative points.
- To pass The IBCP, students must achieve atleast 9 DP points & achieve a PPP for the extended BTEC.
- All assessment for the Pearson BTEC qualifications in this specification is criterion referenced, based on the achievement of specified learning outcomes.
 - To achieve a 'pass' a learner must have satisfied all the pass assessment criteria
 - To achieve a 'merit' a learner must additionally have satisfied all the merit grading criteria

 To achieve a 'distinction' a learner must additionally have satisfied all the distinction grading criteria.

Learners who complete the unit but who do not meet all the pass criteria are graded 'unclassified'. study and fully complete all aspects of the IBCP

- Personal and Professional Skills (PPS) internally assessed
- A course of Language Development (LD) Portfolio internally assessed
- Service Learning work (SL) internally assessed
- A Reflective Project (Students must earn a D or above) internally assessed, externally moderated.
